Parents of seniors should note the registration deadlines for the October SAT (Friday, September 7) and October ACT (Friday, September 21). Registration may be completed online at www.collegeboard.com for the SAT and www.actstudent.org for the ACT. In addition to registration, both websites offer a wealth of information for parents and students.

Students who are taking the ACT and are planning to apply to a UC school must take the ACT with writing or the SAT with Essay. Students applying for admission for the fall term must take these tests no later than December of their senior year, and preferably earlier. For students who take a gap year, exams must be completed by the time of their high school graduation. Students planning to take the ACT and apply to private schools or schools outside California, should check with each respective college or university to identify the specific entrance test requirements.

On Friday, September 7, the academic counselors will visit senior English classes to distribute and discuss a senior timeline. Please ask your student for his or her timeline and keep it in a safe and accessible place. This timeline has many useful dates regarding testing, application, and financial aid deadlines. These dates become increasingly important as the school year progresses.

In September and October, counselors will meet with freshmen, sophomores and juniors during English classes to distribute PSAT and ACT information and publications. For freshmen students, this is the first time the PSAT and the ACT exams are formally explained. For juniors, counselors will review the structure of each exam and discuss planning topics specific to junior year.

Please note that October 10 is a mandatory school day for all students grades 9 - 11. Students will be dismissed by 11:30am on this day.

Again, we wish you the best for you and your student(s) for this upcoming school year and look forward to working with you. Please do not hesitate to call or email if you have any questions.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL NIGHT

The evening will commence with an informative parent meeting followed by a modified daily school schedule which will provide parents an opportunity to meet their student's teachers. ANNUAL BMHS FUNDRAISER

The annual Bishop Montgomery fundraiser begins on August 31 with the distribution of tickets to all students. The school relies on the proceeds of this major fundraiser as part of the operating budget. With parental support we expect 100% of the students to meet at least 100% of their quota - 50 tickets (\$250). The fall fundraiser is our only mandatory, school-wide fundraiser.

Families with one or two students at BMHS are responsible for selling or buying 50 tickets (\$250) per student. Families with three or more students are required to sell 40 tickets (\$200) per student. Students who complete their quota will be eligible for daily cash drawings. In addition, monetary prizes will be awarded to the three top selling homerooms and individuals, after the fundraiser concludes on Tuesday, September 18.

Students who complete at least 50% (\$125) of their quota by 8:30am on Tuesday, September 11 will have noon dismissal on that day. Students who complete 100% (\$250) of their quota by 8:00am Tuesday, September 18 will have a free day on Monday, September 24.

Please note that ticket stubs and money must be turned in together at the same time. Ticket stubs will not be accepted if not accompanied with money. Ticket stubs will not be taken after 12:00pm Tuesday, September 18.

The success of this fundraiser is linked to the enthusiastic participation of both parents and students. We encourage parents to double the amount of their support by investigating matching funds programs through the Human Resources Department of their companies.

Welcome to the 2018 - 2019 school year. Once again, we look forward to embracing the excitement and challenges of the new school year together.

The Discipline Office has a few important reminders.

The Discipline Office sincerely desires that parents and students comply with the uniform policies stated in the Parent Student Handbook. Please be aware that the school does not allow students to wear uniforms which do not fit properly. They should be neither too large, nor too tight. As the sweatshirts sold in the bookstore and Norman's do not shrink, it is unnecessary to buy oversized items. Students must wear pants, shorts, and skirts hemmed to the prescribed length. Unhemmed or frayed pants are not appropriate and are not acceptable. Students should make no other alterations to any uniform items.

Please note the following:

- Students choosing to wear skirts or shorts that do not fit properly, or skirts or shorts that have been altered so that they are shorter, are not appropriate and not acceptable. In the interest of modesty and good taste, the privilege to wear skirts or shorts will be revoked for students who choose to alter the length of the items so that they are too short according to school guidelines.
- The deans will detain any student who does not comply with dress code policy. The school will require a parent to bring appropriate attire in order for the student to attend class.
- The dress code states that students should maintain their natural hair color. If a student has altered his/her hair color during the summer, it is necessary for him/her to take steps to comply with the school rules. The dress code also states that the boys must have their hair cut above the collar, eyebrows and ears. Extreme styles are not permitted. Boys who do not comply with the hair length will not be allowed to attend class until they have cut their hair to the appropriate length. The dress code further states that the boys must be clean-shaven and may not have ear piercings or spacers. Students may not display any body piercings or tattoos.
- Headbands, if worn, may not exceed more than one inch in width. Headscarves are not permitted.

ABSENCE

If a student is absent from school due to a medical appointment, he/she must bring a signed medical slip from the doctor or the dentist, in order to be readmitted. The Parent Student Handbook states "A medical absence/tardy not accompanied by a doctor's note, will be considered unexcused." Please note that if your son/daughter will be absent, regardless of the reason, you must call the Attendance Office and notify the Attendance Clerk the day of the absence. An absence will be considered unexcused, regardless of the reason for the absence, if the parent/guardian does not call the Attendance Office on the day of the absence.

PICK-UP & DROP-OFF

All parents should pick-up and drop-off their students on campus. To avoid the last minute rush, we encourage you to arrive before 7:30am, and follow all procedures. The traffic flow on Torrance Boulevard is heavier after this time and may affect how quickly you are able to exit the campus. Please refrain from picking up or dropping off your students at our neighboring businesses or residential driveways as this creates an inconvenience for our neighbors. Please respect the property of our neighbors by refraining from moving trashcans, taking property, littering, parking, or pulling into our neighbors' driveways. Also, please make sure to drop-off your students in areas that are safe and legal. We have received many reports that there have been BMHS parents or carpools driving recklessly on Palos Verdes Boulevard and students are being dropped-off by their parents/carpool drivers illegally by the red curb zones, in front of fire hydrants, or in the middle of the street. In the interest of the safety of all pedestrians and drivers, and as a courtesy to our neighbors, students should be dropped-off on campus. The Torrance Police Department has also been contacted, and they have informed us that they will be citing drivers along Torrance Boulevard, Henrietta, and Palos Verdes Boulevard. It is essential to give our neighbors the same respect and courtesy that we expect from each other on campus.

CELL PHONES

Students must keep cell phones in lockers, in the off position, during the school day. Your student may not use cell phones during school hours. If a cell phone is confiscated from a student during the school day, the phone will be returned at the end of the day, and the student will be issued a referral.

PARKING

On campus parking spaces that were rented before the middle of June have been assigned, and permits will be distributed the first week of school. Please remind your student that parking spaces are rented to them, and that they must abide by all the parking regulations in order to park his or her vehicle on campus. Parking regulations are posted on the BMHS website. Permits should always be clearly visible in the car window, or he or she risks receiving a parking violation. Lost permits can be replaced in the Activities Office for \$10. Thank you for helping keep our campus safe and secure.

ID/YEARBOOK PICTURE DAY

BMHS ID card and yearbook pictures will be taken on Wednesday, August 29. Details will be given through morning announcements when school begins.

Please note that students are required to have their ID with them at all times while at school. IDs are also required for admittance to all school events and activities. If a student loses or misplaces his or her ID at any point during the school year, he or she is responsible for purchasing a replacement ID for \$20 from the Activities Office. Students run the risk of receiving a violation if they do not have their ID with them when at school or at any school related activity.

SENIOR PORTRAIT MAKE-UPS

Lifetouch Photography will be holding make-up photos for those seniors who have not yet taken their senior portraits. Contact Lifetouch Photography directly in order to schedule an appointment. Seniors who have not taken their portraits by the beginning of September are not guaranteed a portrait in the yearbook.

Please refer to the Parent-Student Handbook for senior dress guidelines. Seniors who fail to adhere to the dress code and grooming guidelines may have their senior portrait omitted from the yearbook at the discretion of the yearbook adviser and administration.

This is a great way for students to find out about BMHS clubs and have representatives answer any questions they may have about how to get involved. 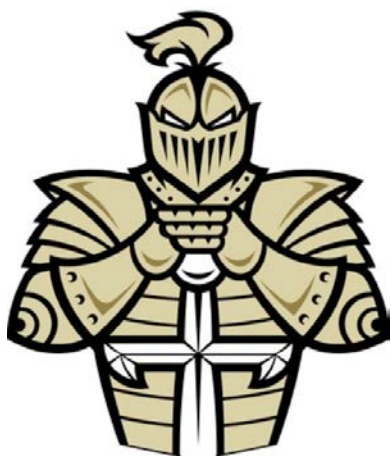
